

I hope that some of the stories will inspire you to learn, love and understand.








Our Australian Friend | Amazing memories at the Building Project

A Bonnytoun experience | An excellent social justice trip

When I first went to Bonnytoun, I was a little nervous about what I was about to experience at the centre. Bonnytoun is a place of safety as well as a juvenile detention facility for boys between the ages of 14 to 17-years-old, whom have been charged with committing a crime and placed in the Bonnytoun Centre whilst they await trial and finalization of their court case.

The volunteers do a social justice trip in which they visit Bonnytoun and other juvenile detention facilities once a week. During this time the volunteers do presentations on relevant discussions to educate the children about topics such as drug and alcohol abuse, gangsterism, violence, and the court process.

The success from this project is when the boys understand and learn about the pressing matters discussed at the presentations. This is one of our longest running projects and volunteers are always keen to get involved and assist with the planning and execution of discussions. I personally feel that it is an excellent and worthwhile initiative.


