## Destinations...

### ■ Bolivia

Work on the Cocha-banner – an English language newspaper "written by the Cocha people, for the Cocha people!" - set up by **Teaching & Projects Abroad**. This paper gives the people of Cochabamba the chance to learn about local topics and air their views, while at the same time practising their English.

If you have an intermediate level of Spanish, you can work on Radio Del Valle. This station broadcasts music, news, sports and youth programmes. Volunteers can get involved researching, recording programmes, learning about production and even participate in radio discussions!

#### China

Based in the fast-paced modern city of Shanghai you can immerse yourself in a fantastic culture. We have a wide range of publications that you can work on; business magazines, entertainment or current affairs magazines: the opportunities are endless. Be at the pulse of this dynamic city, learn about the transition from communism to capitalism and find yourself a step ahead of the rest as you are placed at the cutting-edge of journalism.

#### Ghana

In Ghana you have a choice of journalism projects. We have volunteers working at both radio stations and newspapers, and on a multi-media placement. Most of our journalism projects are based in the lively capital city of Accra, and as a journalism volunteer you will get a unique insight into the city and its people. There is always something happening in Ghana and whether you are interested in football, politics or tribal music, you will never be short of a good story.

#### India

#### Moldova

Our newest Journalism project has volunteers working on a Russian language newspaper in the capital, Chisinau. You will conduct interviews with members of the international community, and then have your articles translated into Russian for the benefit of the local readership.

### ■ Mongolia

There are a number of very different journalism places available to our volunteers in Mongolia. Whether you are working as a reporter on an English-language newspaper or as part of the production team on TV9, you will get a great insight into how the media works in the heart of the country's capital city, Ulaanbaatar.
